

OF UKRAINIANS ARE CONSIDERED O POOR BY THE ABSOLUTE POVERTY RATE. IN 2000 THIS WAS 11.9%

(PEOPLE WHO LIVE ON LESS THEN US\$5 PER DAY BY PURCHASING POWER PARITY)

SINCE 2000, **POVERTY** BY ACTUAL SUBSISTENCE MINIMUM HAS BEEN REDUCED FROM **71%** IN 2000 TO **30%**


